GOSPEL JOHN 20:19-31

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were. for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Now, Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.


How to receive a plenary indulgence on **Divine Mercy Sunday**

The standard three conditions:

- Sacramental Confession
- Eucharistic Communion: Bishop Fabre has waived this requirement for our parishioners at this time.
- Prayers for the intentions of Pope Francis

On Divine Mercy Sunday, there is an additional condition:

- Take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, in a spirit completely detached from sin,
- In the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, recite the Our Father and the Creed adding a devout prayer to the merciful Jesus (e.r. "Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!"

Those who cannot go to church or the seriously ill

Conditions for a Plenary Indulgence:

- totally detesting any sin,
- the intention of fulfilling as soon as possible the three standard conditions of confession, communion and prayers for the Holy Father
- recite the Our Father and the Creed before a devout image of Our Merciful Lord Jesus
- pray a devout invocation to the Merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. Merciful Jesus, I trust in you).

THE SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER SUNDAY OF DIVINE MERCY | ACTION OF THE BAPTIZED: THE CHURCH SUFFERING

The second level of the Church family are those who have also died, like our saintly brethren, but who have yet to be fully purified. We know from scripture (2 Macc. 12:46) and from the Tradition and Authority of the Church that praying for those who have died is a good and righteous action (and a spiritual work of mercy). We as Christians know that purgatory exists because while nothing unclean can enter heaven (Rev. 21:27), venial sins do not merit eternal damnation (1 Cor 3); though they still make one "unclean." Thus, we living members are called, as the Church Militant, to pray for those who still undergo the fires of purgation in order to enter the gates of heaven, fully cleansed as the worthy spouse of Christ.

"TODAY BRING TO ME THE SOULS WHO ARE IN THE PRISON OF PURGATORY AND IMMERSE THEM IN THE ABYSS OF MY MERCY. LET THE TORRENTS OF MY BLOOD COOL DOWN THEIR SCORCHING FLAMES.
