

Beauty: Integritas

What makes something "beautiful"? Is beauty really "in the eye of the beholder"? Beauty is necessary for our lives. Some people reading this right now might think that's an overstatement, but it isn't. Beauty is absolutely necessary for us to live a full and rich life in the Lord, because Beauty is what the Church calls "the splendor of the truth" (in Latin, veritatis splendor). Dr. Denis McNamara states that "Beauty is more than an accidental byproduct of artistic production or a social construct that rests in the eve of the beholder. Beauty has a power." St. John Paul II says that "Beauty enthuses us for work, and work is to raise us up," work here being prayer, which raises us up to God himself (fun fact: the word "enthuse" literally means "to have God put into you")! Thus, Beauty is very important. There are three characteristics of a thing that indeed make it beautiful to everyone (yes, everyone). The first of these things is integritas, meaning "completeness" or "wholeness". The integrity of a thing, it having all of its parts and those parts being properly proportioned, makes that thing beautiful to us. By having all of its parts in proper proportion, a thing can reveal the truth of what it is to us (a cat standing on long. stilted, stork legs might be a fascination, but does not show us the "catness" of the cat, nor does it make it beautiful). A thing* that lacks integrity cannot show me the wholeness of what it is meant to reveal, and thus cannot be perfectly beautiful. And the church building is meant to reveal to me, first and foremost, heaven.

*FOOTNOTE: Please notice in this paragraph (and in most all theological texts on Beauty) the use of the word "thing". Obviously, we are speaking in this section about the things of this world, not about the human person. While wholeness is essential to Beauty, it is not essential to the fullness of human dignity. No one, regardless of whether their body can be deemed as "whole" or not, lacks the complete dignity given to each and every person by God. It is not for their beauty that we should cherish each human person with the utmost charity, but for the simple fact that their dignity is to be upheld over all else.
