READING 1

ISAIAH 55:1-3

GOSPEL

MATTHEW 14:13-21

When Jesus heard of the death of John the Baptist, he withdrew in a boat to a deserted place by himself. The crowds heard of this and followed him on foot from their towns. When he disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, and he cured their sick. When it was evening, the disciples approached him and said, "This is a deserted place and it is already late; dismiss the crowds so that they can go to the villages and buy food for themselves." Jesus said to them, "There is no need for them to go away; give them some food yourselves." But they said to him, "Five loaves and two fish are all we have here." Then he said, "Bring them here to me," and he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing, broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, who in turn gave them to the crowds. They all ate and were satisfied, and they picked up the fragments left over-twelve wicker baskets full. Those who ate were about five thousand men, not counting women and children.

The Real Presence

"The Body of Christ.""The Blood of Christ."We hear these words murmured gently to us as we approach the altar to receive Communion. But do we know what we receive? This is Christ: Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. On the altar, the priest spoke in persona Christi capitis, in the person of Christ the head, as he said "Take this, all of you and eat...Take this, all of you, and drink from it...This is my Body...This is my Blood...". He held this transubstantiated bread and wine aloft, and it was no longer bread and wine. The power of the Holy Spirit, working through the hands of the priest, has changed what before was mere matter into God Himself. This is no mere symbol: this is the greatest sign and reality of our Lord. This truly is Christ. There are few words that can encompass the enormity of this truth. Perhaps that is why our lowly, human response is simply "Amen...I believe."

REFLECTION

- Do I know the one whom I receive?
- Do I cherish the precious Body, savor the precious Blood?
- Do I truly believe that what is being given to me is Jesus Christ, so small and humble, seeking the deepest possible intimacy in my heart?
- When I receive the Eucharist, may my heart forever say "My Lord and My God!"

"The mode of Christ's presence under the Eucharistic species is unique. It raises the Eucharist above all the sacraments as 'the perfection of the spiritual life and the end to which all the sacraments tend.' In the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist "the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained." "This presence is called 'real' - by which is not intended to exclude the other types of presence as if they could not be 'real' too, but because it is presence in the fullest sense: that is to say, it is a substantial presence by which Christ, God and man, makes himself wholly and entirely present."
