LITURGICAL SEASONS PART II

Advent begins our liturgical year as we prepare both to celebrate Christ's first coming and to participate in His second. In Christmas, we spend weeks remembering the birth of Our Lord, the dignity of Mary and of Joseph, and His manifestation to us at His Epiphany and His Baptism. After this, we step back into Ordinary Time where we simply grow with the Lord in the ordered rhythm of the day to day. ("Ordinary" comes from the Latin *ordo* which means "order, row, line, or series.") Then, entering into Lent, we prepare by fasting and prayer and almsgiving to enter with Jesus into His suffering, death, and resurrection during the Sacred Paschal Triduum for the 3 days from Holy Thursday evening to Easter Sunday Evening. Finally, we spend seven weeks celebrating the Resurrection of Our Lord, His Ascension, and the descent of the Holy Spirit. Finally, Summer and Fall take us back into the regular rhythm of ordered or "Ordinary" Time, where we continue to remember the Passion every Friday by our fasting and the Resurrection every Sunday by our worship.

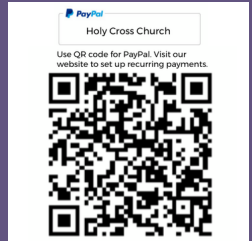
