

READING 1 WISDOM 12:13, 16-19

There is no god besides you who have the care of all, that you need show you have not unjustly condemned. For your might is the source of justice; your mastery over all things makes you lenient to all. For you show your might when the perfection of your power is disbelieved; and in those who know you, you rebuke temerity. But though you are master of might, you judge with clemency, and with much lenience you govern us; for power, whenever you will, attends you. And you taught your people, by these deeds, that those who are just must be kind; and you gave your children good ground for hope that you would permit repentance for their sins.

READING 2 ROMANS 8:26-27

Brothers and sisters: The Spirit comes to the aid of our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes with inexpressible groanings. And the one who searches hearts knows what is the intention of the Spirit, because he intercedes for the holy ones according to God's will.

ANTIPHONS in Ordinary Time

GOSPEL MATTHEW 13:24-43

Jesus proposed another parable to the crowds, saying: "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everyone was asleep his enemy came and sowed weeds all through the wheat, and then went off. When the crop grew and bore fruit, the weeds appeared as well. The slaves of the householder came to him and said, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where have the weeds come from?' He answered, 'An enemy has done this.' His slaves said to him, 'Do you want us to go and pull them up?' He replied, 'No, if you pull up the weeds you might uproot the wheat along with them. Let them grow together until harvest; then at harvest time I will say to the harvesters, "First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles for burning; but gather the wheat into my barn." "He proposed another parable to them. "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that a person took and sowed in a field. It is the smallest of all the seeds, yet when full-grown it is the largest of plants. It becomes a large bush, and the 'birds of the sky come and dwell in its branches." He spoke to them another parable. "The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed with three measures of wheat flour until the whole batch was leavened." All these things Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables. He spoke to them only in parables, to fulfill what had been said through the prophet:

I will open my mouth in parables, I will announce what has

lain hidden from the foundation of the world. Then, dismissing the crowds, he went into the house. His disciples approached him and said, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds in the field." He said in reply, "He who sows good seed is the Son of Man, the field is the world, the good seed the children of the kingdom. The weeds are the children of the evil one, and the enemy who sows them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age, and the harvesters are angels. Just as weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all who cause others to sin and all evildoers. They will throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Whoever has ears ought to hear."

The Mass: Liturgy of the Eucharist II

The Eucharistic Prayer is the most prolific prayer within the Catholic Mass, and contains within it the moment of Transubstantiation, which we will look at in more depth soon. This meticulous prayer draws us into the reality of heaven, where all the angels and saints sing in constant praise that truly "worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!" (Rev. 5:12). It is Christ who prays here now, who makes himself present in the person of the priest and all the baptized. Christ himself calls out to the Father, beseeching him to hear our prayer in the invocation (from the Latin invocare, meaning "to call upon"). Christ rejoices in the salvific actions the Father has already taken on our behalf in the anamnesis (from the Greek ana+mnēmoneuō. meaning "in the midst of memory") of the prayer. He calls down the power of the Holy Spirit, that the gifts which we offer (physical and spiritual) might be sanctified, might be set aside as holy, breathed into by that life-giving Spirit, in the epiclesis (from the Greek epi+kaleō, meaning "to call upon") of this prayer. Once due praise has been given to the Father and to the Lamb whose Body and Blood now reside on the altar for our consumption, we conclude with one last summation of praise to our Triune God, the doxology (from the Greek doxa+logos, meaning "word of glory"): "Through Him, with Him, and in Him, O God Almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, for ever and ever," to which the Church, the Body of Christ, commits a resounding "Amen!"

REFLECTION

- The Eucharistic Prayer can sometimes be overwhelming: how can I pay attention to every single word? The truth is that in our limited humanity, we can't always be 100% all of the time.
- This week, try instead to allow certain parts of the Eucharistic Prayer to sink into your mind. Do your best to pay attention to the whole of the prayer, but focus on smaller parts, so that bit by bit, you can begin to internalize these precious words.

And I beard every creature in beaven and on earth and under the earth and in the sea, and all therein, saying, "To bim who sits upon the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and bonor and glory and might for ever and ever!" And the four living creatures said, "Amen!" and the elders fell down and worshiped.
