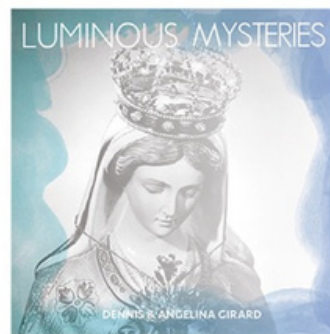
LEARN A BIBLE STUDY ON THE LUMINOUS MYSTERIES: THE TRANSFIGURATION

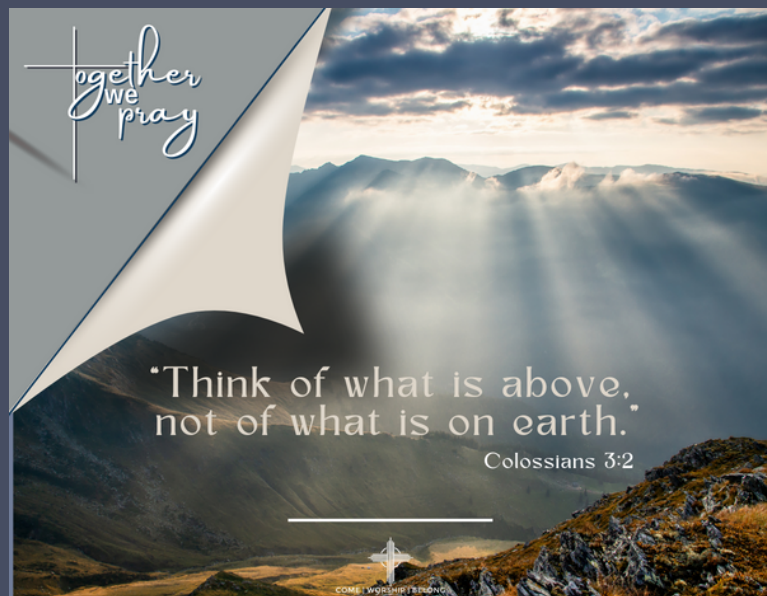
