

The Mass: Liturgy of the Word III

We complete our meditations on the Liturgy of the Word with the prayer which is the literal summation of our Christian faith: **the Creed**. This is not a prayer that has been created for the Mass, but rather a prayer that has stood the test of time simply by being the most succinct way in which Catholics can proclaim the tenants of their faith. It is, admittedly, a very long prayer; the longest that the congregation must recite during Mass. But it is a prayer full of passion, full of longing, full of boldness! A prayer formulated in such a way that I myself must declare what I believe. Not the Church. Not the person sitting next to me. I myself. Martyrs have died in defense of these words. Saints in heaven pray them along with us as they await the resurrection of their bodies. Our Catholic faith has stood in defense of these beliefs for more than two millennia.


