FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

READING 1 ISAIAH 63:16B-17, 19B; 64:2-7 You, LORD, are our father, our redeemer you are named forever. Why do you let us wander, O LORD, from your ways, and harden our hearts so that we fear you not? Return for the sake of your servants, the tribes of your heritage. Oh, that you would rend the heavens and come down, with the mountains quaking before you, while you wrought awesome deeds we could not hope for, such as they had not heard of from of old. No ear has ever heard, no eye ever seen, any God but you doing such deeds for those who wait for him. Would that you might meet us doing right, that we were mindful of you in our ways! Behold, you are angry, and we are sinful; all of us have become like unclean people, all our good deeds are like polluted rags; we have all withered like leaves, and our guilt carries us away like the wind. There is none who calls upon your name, who rouses himself to cling to you; for you have hidden your face from us and have delivered us up to our guilt. Yet, O LORD, you are our father; we are the clay and you the potter: we are all the work of your hands.

WHAT IS LITURGY?

Why are we here? What is the meaning of life and the purpose of my existence? Why did God make me? God made me to know Him, to love Him. and to serve Him in this life and to be with Him forever in the next. In Hebrew the word for serve ('abad) means to serve as we think of it in English. But, when directed to God, the word serve ('abad) means to worship. And the worship of God is very specific. His instructions are clear. We come together to serve, i.e. to worship, God in the way in which He wants to be worshiped. We come together because our God has called us to liturgy. Liturgy, a Greek word, simply means "public work." And when we come for this public work--the worship into which God invites us through His Church we learn about Him as we hear His word proclaimed, we grow in love for Him by spending time with Him, and we receive a foretaste of Heaven, where we will be with Him forever. If we come to our public worship -- Holy Mass, Sacraments, Liturgy of the Host -- prepared and expectant, then we will truly serve God and He will glorify us, raising us up to Heaven.


