

Brothers and sisters:







THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Sanctification of Man

There are two reasons that answer the question of "Why practice liturgy?" The first reason is what we'll look at today: for the sanctification of man. The second (and more important) reason is for the glorification of God, which we'll take a look at next week. But these two ideas are inseparable: for it is by our own sanctification that we glorify God. You've perhaps heard the paraphrased quote from Saint Irenaeus: "The glory of God is man fully alive." However the second half of that sentiment is just as important: "...and the life of man consists in beholding God." Meaning, my living my life to the fullest means living my life completely for Christ, and not for myself. I am fully myself, am fully alive, when I allow God-who is my Creator, my greatest love, and the goal of my entire life—to work through me. So, how do I sanctify myself? How do I learn how to have the best life possible, be the best version of myself? I go to Mass, and I pray. Simple as that. I pay attention to the liturgical action; I submerge myself in the depths of the mystery which Christ is inviting me into. I take notice of all of the sacramental happenings during the liturgy and behold their goodness, their power, and their striking beauty. I find confidence not necessarily when my Mass is made "flashy" or "hip", but rather in the stability of practice which has been instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church for millenia. I find grandeur in the silence of the in between moments; I see the shoots of growth coming from the roots of the liturgy that will lead me out the doors and into a life of social justice rooted in the Sacraments. I allow myself to be moved by the liturgy, and in that movement I begin the journey toward sanctification, and toward a fuller glorification of God by my life.



- Do I see the liturgy sanctifying me?
- Am I participating in it with the fervor necessary for it to do so?
- This week at Mass, what is one way in which I can more fully enter into the Sacrifice of Jesus on the altar, and what can I take with me out into the world to live the Christian life more fully?


